

Japanese week in Brussels 2013



11 – 18 March

On the 11th March, Japan will commemorate the second anniversary of the Earth-Quake and Tsunami that devastated the Tohoku Region. It has already been two years since the disaster, but there still remains a lot of work to be done.

A "Japanese week" of commemoration will be held in Brussels on the 11th-18th March and will contain a range of cultural events and a series of seminars related to Japan. With this week of events we aim to give encouragement to those who continue to suffer in the aftermath of the disaster, and show our gratitude to our friends in Europe for their solidarity with us.

As a symbol of solidarity between Europe and Japan, a Haiku Post (a mail box, haiku is a form of Japanese poem) will be displayed during the Japanese week at BOZAR, the Centre for Fine Arts (Hall Horta).
