About JBCE






Committees



The E&E Committee mainly deals with environmental and energy product regulations: **Climate Policy** (Fit for 55, RepowerEU), **Circular Economy** (Ecodesign, Battery, Packaging, WEEE, ELV), **Chemicals** (RoHS, REACH, CLP, Nanomaterial).



The DI Committee mainly deals with European digital policies such as **GDPR**, the **Data Act, AI and Cybersecurity**. The committee also acts as a bridge between the Japanese and European authorities under the **Japan-EU Digital Partnership**.



The CS Committee mainly covers areas such as sustainable finance (Taxonomy), business & human rights (CS3D, FLPB), and disclosure of non-financial information (CSRD/ESRS).



The S&C Committee follows trends in European and international developments in relation to standardization, technical regulations and conformity assessment. It deals with requirements related to **CE marking** and **third-party certification**.



The Trade Policy Committee has so far followed the Japan-EU EPA, Brexit, and WTO-related issues. In recent years, it has also been dealing with policies related to carbon taxes, human rights and economic security.



EU INSTITUTIONS MAKEOVER 2024

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN 2024? AT A GLANCE

- The political leaders of the EPP, S&D and Renew, together with Ursula von der Leyen, agreed to delay the confirmation of the candidates for the Executive Vice-Presidencies (EVPs), with the aim of creating an overall package to approve the six nominees. Tensions rose on 12th November, with EPP and far-right MEPs sometimes using the hearings as platforms to criticise the policies of the Commissioner's national governments. Consequently, the leaders did not reach an agreement. A deal is unlikely to happen before 27th November, but the full list of Commissioners must be voted on by 28th November at the latest if the new European Commission is to take office as intended on 1st December. As a result, the date set could easily be postponed, perhaps even to next year.
- The confirmation hearings of the Commissioners-designate took place between 4th and 12th November 2024. They were subjected to a three-hour grilling during which they were asked specific questions relating to their portfolios.
- Following the performance of Commissioner-designate Olivér Várhelyi during his hearing, the EPP, the S&D, Renew, and the Greens voted against him during the evaluation meeting. Várhelyi has been asked to answer a second round of written questions.
- According to the media, MEPs gave the green light for Hadja Lahbib and Jessika Roswall to become European Commissioners as part of a backroom deal between the EPP, the S&D, and Renew that included agreeing on the competences of the European Parliament's new health committee.
- At the informal European Council held in Budapest, Hungary, EU leaders adopted the Budapest Declaration on the New European Competitiveness Deal. They called for the European Commission to provide a number of concrete proposals and clear timelines by June 2025.
- The leaders of the EU institutions congratulated Donal Trump for his re-election as President of the United States and called for strong EU-US ties and cooperation on global challenges.
- German Chancellor Olaf Scholz has fired his finance minister over his obstructionist attitude to budget disputes, leading to the collapse of the ruling coalition. On 16th December 2024, Scholz will face a parliamentary confidence vote in his government, which he is expected to lose, possibly triggering early elections on 23rd February 2025.
- Ireland's Prime Minister Simon Harris confirmed that the country's early general election will take place on 29th November 2024. Government formation talks could begin in December, but a new government may not be in place until the new year.
