

The up-coming *Conference on EU-Japan Relations* will mark the **10**th **anniversary** of an ongoing project aimed at understanding the inherent prospects within the evolving relationship between the EU and Japan. As major economic and commercial players, which also have a significant normative implications as well as a security footprint, Japan and the EU have developed a complex multifaceted relationship which has come to play a key role within global governance dynamics.

The 2008 Conference, entitled *Japan-European Union: A Strategic Partnership in The Making*, will give all parties involved in this decade-long dialogue the opportunity to reflect on the progress made both within academic research as well as on the ground, most notably within the EU's strategic partnership policy vis-à-vis Japan. As such the conference will address the EU-Japan partnership in all its complexity, thus highlighting the varying visions and approaches to Strategic Partnership, as well as its different key dimensions (Security, Economy & People-to-People Relationships). Moreover, the conference will also include a more prospective dimension as it will address the future of the European Union and its impact on its strategic partnerships, and the emerging prospects for Europe-Asia Relations.

Under the ongoing stewardship of the Université Libre de Bruxelles - Institut d'Etudes Européennes (ULB-IEE) and the Tokyo-based International Christian University's Social Science Research Institute and its COE Program; with support of several supporting partners — Egmont, KULeuven — other ULB research centres as well as two key European networks (GARNET & TEPSA), the 10th Brussels Annual Conference on EU-Japan Relations will offer a clear overview of the outcomes of two decade long parallel evolutions: the growing strategic partnership between the EU and Japan and the ongoing academic dialogue it generated.


